Comments

Moves further sanctions of some juvenile offenders from the Department of Family Services to the relevant court. This is probably an improvement, but not great enough to raise it to a good bill.

N: No fiscal or personnel impact. Provides that conditions of release from Wyoming boys' school and Wyoming girls' school are imposed specifically by the juvenile court. A positive spin on this bill says it makes the release responsibility for juveniles more specific. From the broad perspective of Liberty, this is neutral.
